<p>School provides two 40 minute sessions for all children every week. Providing both an indoor and outdoor session.</p> <p>This means that all children have a statutory 80 minutes of PE per week. Activities are provided at break times and lunch times for children to be physically active through the use of the all-weather pitch as well as activities provided by staff such as skipping, basketball and balance beams in KS2. Two sports coaches attend KS1 daily and provide multisport activities on a lunch time. A wide range of sporting based after school clubs delivered by trained coaches and staff members.</p>	<p>Increase range of afterschool clubs and variety available.</p>	<p>Coaching fees Annually £8750.00</p>	<p>All sports clubs are well attended and often have waiting lists for pupils wishing to participate. All staff deliver the timetabled PE sessions. Break and lunch time sessions have been successful with an increasing number of children participating in the activities available.</p>	<p>PE sessions are fixed and sustainable. Staff are readily available to provide activities at lunch and break time. Next steps: Increase the range of activities available to the children.
